Learning in Less Than 15 Minutes!

What is an InfoByte? It's a short presentation on a topic of interest to county officials. A new InfoByte, titled <u>Bonds or Insurance?</u>, has been posted on the change to T.C.A. § 8-19-101 that allows counties to obtain an insurance policy to insure the lawful performance of their fiduciary duties and responsibilities by the officials and employees listed in the policy.

There are three new economic development InfoBytes: one that defines economic development, one on the topic of retail, and one on the topic of tourism. Another InfoByte posted earlier this year titled Why Don't We Govern Together? describes the two methods for city-county consolidation. There are also InfoBytes available on ethics, budgeting, personnel, and public safety topics. If you've got a little bit of time, you can learn a little bit of information by checking out an InfoByte!

COCTP Fees: What You Need to Know

\$300 Enrollment Fee

This fee is paid to enroll in the COCTP. There is an Enrollment Invoice on the CTAS Training webpage www.ctas.tennessee.edu. Select Training and then Forms to access the Enrollment Invoice.

The training department will begin enforcing the policy for the \$300 COCTP enrollment fee. Beginning September 30, 2016, participants will only be allowed to retain credit for classes passed within 180 days of paying the COCTP enrollment fee. Prior to September 30, 2016, anyone who pays the enrollment fee will be granted credit for all classes passed.

If you plan to enroll in COCTP and want credit for classes taken more than 180 days ago, you must pay your \$300 COCTP enrollment fee before September 30, 2016.

\$300 Capstone Fee


This is a one-time fee paid to attend the Capstone Event. You will receive a letter from CTAS notifying you of your eligibility, which will include an invoice for the event.

\$100 Recertification Fee

This fee is assessed on a yearly basis to all officials and employees who obtain the Certified Public Administrator designation. It is valid for one year and must be paid by September 1st of each year.
