CTAS Featured Service: InfoBytes

Some current challenges to learning and development include time constraints, information overload, and inexperienced employees. As a county official, your time is very valuable. In another effort at providing assistance to county officials, CTAS launched InfoBytes in the summer of 2015. InfoBytes are bite-sized presentations on topics and issues of interest to county officials. A county official should be able to complete each InfoByte in less than 15 minutes.



InfoBytes already available include Drug Fund, Maintenance of Effort, Ethics for County Commissioners, and Tennessee Legislative Update

2015. There are also several InfoBytes on developing an operating budget. The newest InfoByte is titled Purchasing for County Commissioners. This InfoByte provides an overview of the purchasing laws so any county official involved with purchasing may find it helpful.

Most InfoBytes include audio and they are easy to navigate. County officials can access them as many times as they need to learn, research or review a topic. InfoBytes are available from the CTAS website. While they are not for COCTP credit, they do provide helpful information in a bite-sized portion.



Racial Profiling Prevention Act

PUBLIC CHAPTER 335 SB 6 - HB 57

During the 2015 legislative session, the General Assembly passed the Racial Profiling Prevention Act. The Act requires each state and local law enforcement agency to adopt, **on or before January 1, 2016**, a written policy that prohibits racial profiling by its employees. The Act defines "racial profiling" as the detention or interdiction of an individual in traffic contacts, field contacts, or asset seizure and forfeiture efforts solely on the basis of the individual's actual or perceived race, color, ethnicity, or national origin.

The Act became effective on May 4, 2015 and was codified at T.C.A. § 38-1-501 et seq.
